SYRINGE DRIVER COMPETENCY PROGRAMME

Venue: Boardroom, McDougall House 24 McDougall Ave, Merivale

The Hospice New Zealand Syringe Driver Competency Programme is for registered and enrolled nurses and develops the knowledge and skills required to manage subcutaneous infusions using the Niki T34 / Bodyguard T syringe driver.

Initial certification provides 4 hours of professional development and involves completion of pre-reading, attendance at a two-hour workshop, demonstration of practical competence and completion of a written test. Certification is maintained by attending a 2 yearly update.

TE ARA WHAKAPIRI EDUCATION

Venue: Ballroom, McDougall House 24 McDougall Ave, Merivale

Te Ara Whakapiri is used in the last days of life. It aims to optimise symptom management alongside holistic care. This session is ideal for nurses and caregivers new to palliative and end of life care and includes diagnosing dying, how to use the toolkit, medication management and how to provide family support.

FOUNDATIONS IN PALLIATIVE CARE

- Care in the Last Days of Life
- Communication and Goals of Care
- Grief, Loss and Bereavement Support
- Spiritual Care

PALLIATIVE CARE FOR CAREGIVERS

This Hospice New Zealand education programme is an alternative to Fundamentals of Palliative Care and helps caregivers, working in all care settings, explore their role in providing palliative care.

The course consists of four 90-minute seminars and is usually delivered on site to a group of 10 -15 caregivers. There is a small cost for the course workbook.

This programme is not intended for registered nurses who should either complete Fundamentals of Palliative Care or Foundations in Palliative Care
